Training Course Outcomes

- On successful completion of this Traffic Control training course, applicants can apply for a Traffic Controller Licence in Queensland.

Prerequisites

- Must be 18 years or age and have held a provisional drivers licence (either Australian or Foreign) for a minimum of 12 months in the past 5 years.
- Some criminal convictions in the past 5 years may exclude you from obtaining accreditation. Contact us for further details.

Other Information

- On completion of the Traffic Control training course the applicants will need to apply to Queensland Transport for their Traffic Control Licence, this will incur an additional cost of \$125.80 ** for a three year licence. A Criminal History Check is also conducted by Queensland Transport (included in cost) with the Licence application.
- Traffic Controllers are required to undertake a refresher course every three years in order to maintain their accreditation. We can supply this training as required.
- In accordance with the new Traffic Management Code of Practice, all Traffic Controllers must complete a General Safety Induction (White Card). The Blue Card (issued before 1/07/09 or equivalent from another state) is also accepted.

Assessment criteria will be by:

- Written questionnaire (where literacy skills are a problem this is carried out in a one on one informal question and answer situation),
- Practical exercises,
- Workshops amongst the participants.
- Group discussion, and
- Other assessment methodology.
